

- Gambling.
- Indecent exposure, that is, exposure to sight of the private parts of the body in a lewd or indecent manner.

III. CONSEQUENCES

Students who are found to have violated the district's Code of Conduct may be subject to the following consequences, either alone or in combination. The school personnel identified after

- To make the best use of the educational system to become a useful member of society.
- To attend school every scheduled day unless they are legally excused.
- To be in class on time and prepared to learn.
- To be familiar with and abide by all district policies, rules and regulations.
